Subject: AIJCA Scholarships

Enclosed you will find the guidelines and an application for selection of American-International Junior Charolais Association (AIJCA) Scholarships. Review the scholarship program guidelines before completing your application.

AIJCA Scholarships are awarded to current AIJCA members on the basis of scholastic excellence in high school and/or college, demonstrated AIJCA or associated affiliate leadership, interest in the cattle industry, and youth leadership activities.

The American-International Charolais Foundation, Inc. Scholarship Fund requires applicants to be enrolled in an agricultural course or in a related field of academic endeavor in a bona fide college or university. The following scholarship funds do not restrict the applicants field of study to agriculture: Walker/Phillips, Canada Coal, Charlie and Jean Smith, Joe and Carolynne Garrett, Wesson Memorial, Stauffer Memorial, and Taylor Thomas Memorial.

The number of AIJCA scholarship recipients and the dollar amount awarded shall be determined each year by the scholarship selection committee. Scholarships are paid from the income derived from the principal fund. Scholarships are awarded in two stipends: one-half for the fall semester; and one-half for the spring semester.

To be considered for the above mentioned AIJCA scholarships, complete the enclosed application. Your completed application, including the necessary signatures and an official copy of your most recent college transcript (high school transcript if you will be a first-semester freshman), and all three letters of recommendation must be postmarked no later than April 30, 2011, and mailed to AICA, Attn: Director of Junior Activities & Foundation 11700 NW Plaza Circle, Kansas City, MO 64153.

You are encouraged to enclose all of the required scholarship material in one envelope and forward to the AICA office. If material will be sent separately it will be the applicant's responsibility to ensure the appropriate individuals or institutions have forwarded the required material. The AICA office will not contact applicants if a portion of their required material has not been received.

Scholarship recipients will be announced at the 2011 Charolais Junior National Awards Banquet in Kansas City, MO, in June 2011.

(If more than 3 letters of recommendation are sent, it will be at the discretion
of the scholarship committee to randomly disregard additional letters to reduce
number of recommendation letters to 3.)

You are encouraged to enclose all of the required scholarship material in one envelope and forward to the AICA office.

Do not write or type on the back of the application. Include additional pages if necessary.

If material will be sent separately it will be the applicant's responsibility to ensure the appropriate individuals or institutions have forwarded the required material.

The AICA office will not contact applicants if a portion of their required material has not been received.

AIJCA membership dues for the application year must be paid by April 30, for application to be considered by the Scholarship Committee.

AIJCA Scholarship Guidelines

1. Scholarship applicants must be paid members of the American-International Junior Charolais Association (AIJCA) and obtained at least senior year status in high school when applying. Scholarship recipients must be enrolled full time (minimum of 12 semester hours) in an accredited college or university.

A maximum number of four AIJCA scholarships will be awarded to a student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. A graduate degree program student is not eligible for an AIJCA scholarship.

The American-International Charolais Foundation, Inc. Scholarship Fund requires applicants to be enrolled in an agriculture related field of academic endeavor at an accredited college or university. Without limitation, examples of qualified majors shall be animal science, agricultural business, agricultural education, agricultural journalism, veterinary medicine and agricultural economics.

The following scholarship funds do not restrict the applicants field of study to agriculture: Walker/Phillips, Canada Coal, Charlie and Jean Smith, Joe and Carolynne Garrett, Wesson Memorial, Stauffer Memorial and Taylor Thomas Memorial.

State and affiliate organizations who periodically offer scholarships determine their own applicant guidelines.

2. Applications will be scored by the AICF Board of Trustees.
3. The number and amount of AIJCA Scholarships shall be determined each year by the selection committee.
4. Each selection committee member shall independently review and score each application received and select the recipient(s) based on the following criteria:
 - 1-10, scholastic record;
 - 1-15, demonstrated AIJCA or associated affiliate leadership;
 - 1-10, interest in the cattle industry;
 - 1-10, youth leadership activities.
5. The scores shall be compiled by AICA and winners will be announced at the AIJCA annual awards banquet held in conjunction with the Junior National Leadership Conference.
6. Prior to the issuance of the fall and spring stipends, scholarship recipients must submit the following two items to the AICA Director of Junior Activities:
 - A. Proof of full-time enrollment and good standing from the college or university's registrar's office;
 - B. An official copy of the student's academic transcript.

The student is required to meet a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above based on a 4.0 point system. To obtain the spring stipend, 12 completed semester hours must appear on the fall semester's grade report.
